





This week I would like to make sure everyone knows about our grief support and caregiver groups. We are privileged to have some amazing people guiding these groups. We have all had more that our share struggles this last few years. These groups are designed to help us learn skills that will make these kinds of life changing events in our lives a little easier.

Of course you all know that I have PhD. from Harvard, but even with my advanced education and immense talent and intellect, I don't know how to deal with these types of trials. I called my mom this morning to ask her to share some thoughts. She and my dad took care of my grandma for several years and then shortly after she passed away my dad was diagnosed with a rare genetic disease which slowly took his life. When I talked to my mom this morning she said that the biggest help to her was realizing that she did not know how to handle it. She found a group and that saved her. She was literally having physical pain. After she asked for help she was overwhelmed by the number of people who had been through it already and were so willing to guide her. She told me to let everyone know that "you are not alone" She offered to talk to anyone who could benefit from her experience over the last 20 years as a caregiver and as someone who lost two people she loved dearly.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE DOUGH OVERNIGHT OATS



Ingredients:

- 1 cup old fashion oats
- 2 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- 1/3 cup vanilla Greek yogurt
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter
- 3 tablespoons chocolate chips
- 1 cup milk of your choice

Instructions:

- 1. Place all of the ingredients into a mixing bowl, and whisk to combine well.
- 2. Fill a jar or airtight container (I like mason jars) with the oat mixture and allow to chill overnight in the refrigerator.


Optional Variations:

- Add different types of chocolate. Try using dark chocolate chips, white chocolate chips, or a combination of both.
- **Mix in some nuts.** Chopped almonds, pecans, or walnuts would all be delicious in this recipe.
- Mix In some chia seeds. Chia seeds will offer a thicker texture and are full of fiber.
- Try using different types of oats. You can use rolled oats, steel cut oats, or even oat bran in this recipe.
- Add some dried fruit. Diced dried apricots, cranberries, or raisins would all be tasty additions to the overnight oats.
- **Experiment with different sweeteners.** Instead of using maple syrup, try using honey or agave nectar for a different flavor.

Add some spices. A pinch of cinnamon or nutmeg would add an extra depth of flavor to the overnight oats.
