SPOTLIGHT ~ CLARK RILEY ~

Clark was born April 27, 1941, in rural Sebastian County in Western Arkansas. His parents Dock and Alma Riley were schoolteachers. Back then you signed a one-year contract with a school, so his parents taught at many different schools in the area while attending college in the summers to earn master's. While his parents were away him and his siblings would stay with aunt and uncles and run wild through the countryside with cousins.

In Sept of 1941, as WWII loomed the U.S. Government acquired 15,163 acres from 712 property owners at a cost of \$1.35 million to establish Fort Chaffe, Arkansas. Clark's great grandparents had settled the land in 1872 when they migrated to Arkansas. The family's farm was purchased, and they were moved out of the camp. His parents purchased a house that was being moved. It was cut in half moved and then put back together but apparently not very well because the walls never lined up. They lived just across the road from Fort Chaffee and interacted with the soldiers daily. He has many wonderful stories to tell about that time. One day the family came home from town and discovered the house had been sprayed with machine gun fire and the sun was shining through all the holes in the ceiling.

Clark attended school in Charleston, Arkansas and was a student when the small town became the first town in the South to incorporate desegregation in grades 1-12 in 1954. There is now a monument in front of the Elementary School marking this historical moment, but Clark says "It wasn't a big deal we were all just kids and friends outside of school. We didn't know they were making history." Senator Dale Bumpers wife Betty was Clark's 6th grade teacher.


In 1955 his family moved to Cove, Arkansas where he graduated from high school and meet his wife, Sandra Dunagan. They were married in 1963 and both attended Southern Arkansas University where Clark majored in business. After college he entered the Air Force as an officer and served from 1963 until 1967. He was with SAC and was stationed in Texas, Kansas, Illinois and Cal-

ifornia. While in Sacramento his daughter Jennifer was born in 1966. In 1967 they moved back to Cove and in 1969 his son Phillip was born. He always says he regrets leaving the Air Force and wishes he had stayed for life.

In 1969 they moved to Mena where he lived until 2017. He became business partners with his father-in-law at Dunagan Wood Products producing wooden ammo boxes for the military and pallets for the trucking industry until 1986 when he returned full time to Riley Heating and Air. He owned and operated it until 1996 when he suffered a head injury in a car wreck that left him disabled and he retired.

Clark loves anything with a motor: planes, cars, motorcycles, lawnmowers you name it! Him and his brother Harold were active in the Queen Wilhelmina Rod Run for many years while rebuilding antique cars and hot rods. He owned a motorcycle dealership and a small engine plane that he flew around Mena in his younger days. He was also a skilled photographer passing the love on to his daughter and grandson.

Clark moved to Midway in 2017 to live with his daughter, husband and five children. They keep him active driving his grandson back and forth to school every day, mowing the yard, helping the neighbors out and tinkering in the garage. If you drive down Sunflower Lane, you will usually spot him in his rolling office chair sun tanning in the driveway, supervising the construction workers, and watching the planes fly over. His son, grandson and great granddaughter still live in Arkansas. His wife passed away in 2010 and both his brother and sister passed away in 2020.


