



RECIPE OF THE MONTH

LEMON BARS



Ingredients:

- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 4 Tablespoons lemon juice
- 4 eggs, room temperature

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Mix together the flour, butter and powdered sugar with a fork.
- 3. Press the mixture evenly into a ungreased 9" x 13" pan.
- 4. 4. Bake for 20 minutes.
- 5. 5. Beat remaining ingredients until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes.
- 6. 6. Pour over hot crust and bake for 25 more minutes.
- 7. Cool. Dust with powdered sugar and then cut into squares.


